

**TIMBERLAKE CIVIC ASSOCIATION MEETING
MINUTES FROM
April 1, 2008**

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 p.m.

Doug Jones read the treasurer's report, which showed a starting balance of \$17,347.89 and an ending balance of \$18,817.94. The treasurer's report was approved as read.

Geri Radaszewski read the secretary's minutes from the February and March meetings. The minutes were approved as read.

There have been reports of coyotes and dogs off-leash in the area. A coyote attacked a man in the Naperville area and an American Bulldog tried to attack a resident while being walked past his home. All dogs should be on leash. Please pick up after your dog when walking it.

Champagne Lodge (Essence Suites): IDOT fined Hanson \$3,000 although it cost \$15,000 to clean up his mess. The state, feds and township are working to get new trees planted. Riggs was the judge on the case. Joe Burkett said IDOT dropped the ball, producing minimal evidence and not cooperating with state attorneys. The tower is 76 ft. tall (62.7 ft was approved on the permit.). He was red tagged, fined and must reapply for a permit. The county is reworking their codes, but he is grandfathered in. The tower will have a sign and clock that may not extend beyond the tower and must be flat against the building.

91st & Clarendon Hills Road, Northwest: No word on the construction and no work is being done. The retention pond is gross and a potential mosquito problem.

91st & Clarendon Hills Road, Southeast: Adoption Center: The county has no clue what happened. There has been no word for some time.

91st & Route 83, Southeast: There has been no activity with the county except stormwater approval.

The lot behind Walgreen's and Clarendon Hills Road: Nothing has been happening there either.

Charlotte Krueger has surgery and the association sent her a get-well basket of flowers.

Directories and vehicle stickers were available at the meeting.

Membership drive: Charlotte reported that 413 homes responded from the following areas:

60 of 79 seniors gave money even though they didn't have to. Lots of responses came in late and won't be listed. We raised \$5,080 in dues and donations.

The Timberlake Civic Association Picnic has been scheduled for Sunday August 24, the Sunday before Labor Day. A \$10 refundable deposit is required. It will be held at the Argonne National Lab Pavilion.

Address Signs: The form for ordering is on the website or you can send in one of the paper forms that have been distributed. The cost is \$10. 190 have been ordered so far. Call Doug Jones for your signs. If your mailbox is across the street, see the home at 10S052 Clarendon Hills Road for an example of how you can display the sign.

CFL bulbs: The Feds are trying to ban incandescent bulbs, but there are concerns. The bulbs have a strobe effect, which some people are sensitive to and they contain mercury making disposal a hazardous waste matter. One resident reported that IKEA will take spent CFL bulbs as will the recycling center on Route 53 south of 75th Street. Any holes in the lining will give off UV radiation and they cannot be used with dimmers.

Brush pickup east of Clarendon Hills Road will begin April 14. The west side is scheduled to begin April 28.
